BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE COLLEGE:

A) EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AND COURSES OFFERED

1. UNDERGRADUATE LEVEL

Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA)

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and semester system have been introduced from the academic session 2013-2014 by the State Government under RUSA. The main feature of the CBCS is to make undergraduate education student centric and prepare them to compete locally, regionally, nationally as well as globally. Within CBCS, students have complete freedom to choose their subjects from a pool of subjects suggested by the UGC. As CBCS strives to create a holistic syllabus, therefore from the session 2016-2017, in addition to dedicated focus on a discipline through core paper, elective papers have been added. Besides, keeping in line with the vision of the Government, special emphasis has been given to Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses.

2. POST-GRADUATE LEVEL

The College provides Post-graduation in English, Political Science, Hindi, Economics, Commerce and History. The strength has not only increased but also has given good results. Besides it, the self-financing course under the faculty of **PGDCA** is also operational in this College.

3. ADD-ON COURSES

Keeping in mind the cut-throat competitive scenario in employment sector, the college has been successfully running **four** “**Add-on Courses**” in

- **Functional English**
- **Fashion Designing**
- **Marketing Management**
- **Tourism and Travel Management.**

These future-oriented and skill-based courses inculcate the virtues of self-confidence and competitive spirit which are definitely going to help our students to have an edge over the others.

B) INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

We have upgraded our infrastructure and are constantly in process of doing the same, so that our students find themselves second to none as far as exposure and modern facilities that supplement education are concerned. Our achievements include:

a) AUDITORIUM-cum-LIBRARY

The college is proud to own a spacious and well-equipped Auditorium-cum-library. While the high-tech auditorium provides a first-class venue to harvest the talent of our students, the well-equipped modern Library serves as a treasure-house of knowledge. The auditorium can house an audience upto 1000 people and is designed for multi-purpose use, from hosting programmes of academic importance to cultural activities, in addition to various competitions and multifarious entertainment.

The “Modern Library” is fully equipped with advanced technology. It has nearly **20,000 books** in total, out of which 11897 books include text books and reference books and 7892 books are in community section. In addition to these we have seven daily newspapers, 55 magazines and journals. It also has an **e-resource centre**. The college library through **INFFLIBNET** (Information and Library Network Center of UGC) also provides online access to **e-books, e-journals** and online library to teachers and students.

b) ARTS AND SCIENCE BLOCKS

There are separate blocks for Art and Science faculties of the college. The Science Block has 6 spacious Halls and 6 laboratories for conducting theory and practical classes. The science Block also houses the Departments of Geography, English and Music. Apart from the 10 smart class rooms that have been constructed in the Arts Block; it includes two IT Labs, Staff Room, NSS

,NCC and Sports Rooms; the Conference Hall and the Office of IGNOU Study Center. The classes of Commerce section are also held in this block.

c) **HOSTELS (Boys and Girls)**

There are two hostels in the college that provide boarding facilities to the meritorious and deserving students. Both the hostels are equipped with Water Purifiers, Solar-heating Systems, Sick Rooms, Guest Room and Reading Room.

d) **COMPUTER LAB**

Computers form an essential feature and component in the modern world and their role in imparting knowledge and transforming lives of people, especially of students cannot be ignored. Thus, keeping in pace with the hi-tech and competitive world, the college is equipped with **100 computers** of which **60 computers** are installed in the **two computer labs**. One of these labs is a multi-purpose lab that is being used as **Language Lab, Aptitude Lab and Career and Counselling Lab**. These labs are also provided with **over-head projectors** and **ten broad-band connections**. In addition to this, the college has a computer lab funded by UGC having **ten computers** and **ten broad band** connections. Besides IT department, students from various faculties are being benefitted by the Computer Labs.

e) **CONFERENCE HALL**

To hold the meetings of the Staff Council, and to organize Conferences and Seminars, the college has a well-furnished conference hall.

f) **CANTEEN**

The college canteen is a place of refreshment for the college staff as well as students. It offers a great variety of food items and snacks at nominal prices.

g) **PLAYGROUND**

The vast playground of the college provides for organizing various outdoor games like Volleyball, Kabbadi, Cricket, Athletics, etc.

h) **GYMNASIUM**

Keeping in mind the fitness in this hectic and stressful era, the college provides free of cost gymnasium facility to the students and the college staff.

i) BIO-TOILETS

There are 6 eco-friendly bio-toilets in the college, besides the conventional toilets.

C) OTHER FACILITIES

- Facility of **Wi-Fi, INFLIBNET, Biometric Machine** and **CCTV**.
- Installed **Water Purifiers** and **Coolers**.
- Adopting modern technology in education, the college has set up an **E- Resource Center** in the library, **5 computer labs** and **10 Smart Class Rooms**.

D) UNIQUE FEATURES AND BEST PRACTICES

- GPGC Seema became the first college in Himachal to start portal for **online admission fees** in the year 2018.
- College holds the distinction among the state colleges to have its own **Mahavidyalaya gaan**: “Jai Jai ho Seema Mahavidyalaya” which is sung on every important occasion.
- Every morning National Anthem is played at 10:00 am; the entire college comes to a still in honour of our motherland daily.
- College has its own calendar and table calendar.
- We have practice of dress code for students that pupils are made to wear twice a week.
- College holds distinction for being shortlisted among 6 colleges of the state for the degree course in **Biotechnology**.

Most of our students in sciences and humanities have got **O and A++** that corresponds to the grade point **8 and 7.5** respectively.

- **Participation in Swachh Bharat Summer Internship(SBSI)**. It was launched by the Govt. of India in May 2018 to enroll students for promoting swachhta in the villages. **52** NSS volunteers undertook various activities including organizing awareness campaigns, conducting door-to door meetings, rallies, nuked natak on the theme of cleanliness, stop open defecation in villages etc.
- **Organization of Block Level Youth Parliament on Yoga**. Nehru YUVA Kendra, Shimla in association with the College NSS Units organized a Block Level **Youth Parliament on yoga** in the College on 20.06.2018. The main objective of the event was to generate yoga awareness and linkage among youth and masses. Prof. B.S.Pirta and Prof. C.S.Rangta acted as Resource Persons. About 150 students and staff members were benefitted from this programme.
- **Participation in National Integration Camp (NIC) and Pravasi Bharatiya Divas -2019 at Varanasi**. 2 volunteers viz; Gitika Sambra (Bsc 6th Sem) and Vijay Kumar (B.A.6th Sem) participated in the National Integration Camp(NIC) and Pravasi Bharatiya Divas -2019 held at Varanasi) from 18-24th January 2019 among 250 volunteers of the 15 regional centers across 22 states of the country. Dr. Gopal Dutt Sharma, NSS Programme Officer Unit-II of the College participated as contingent-in-charge of the Chandigarh Region.

- **Participation in National Level Adventure Camp (NIC) at Dharmasala.** 2 volunteers Pooja Thakur (B.A.4th Sem) and Akshu Andta (B.A.6th Sem) participated in the National Level Adventure Camp held at Dharamsala from 11th September to 21st September, 2018 and acquired training and basic skills in rock climbing, rock repelling, river crossing, tracking etc. during the 10 days camp.
- **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan(UBA) 2.0** is a flagship programme of the Ministry of Human Resource Development with the intention to enrich rural India. Our College is among 750 higher educational across India (both technical and non technical) and among a few Participating Institutes (PIs) in H.P. selected by Govt. of India under UBA 2.0 launched on 25.04.2018. The college has adopted five villages viz; Seema, Bijouri, Rantari, Masli and Tangnu in Rohru and Chirgaon blocks of Shimla District and has undertaken village and Base line Household Survey in these villages through the NSS volunteers and students of the College. The information collected is being uploaded in the website of the IIT Delhi which is the coordinating Institute of UBA 2.0 in the country, for its analysis and preparing village development plan for each village. An amount of Rs 50,000/- (10,000/- for each village) has been received to undertake the survey work in the adopted villages. Dr. Gopal Dutt Sharma, Associate Professor and NSS Programme officer of the College is looking after the work of UBA 2.0 in the College as Institutional UBA Coordinator.

- **Regular Activities**
